Resurrection - to Provide Life

(John 10:10; 11:25; 14:6)

■ 1 Corinthians 15

His resurrection is connected to our faith (vs 14).

His resurrection is connected to our preaching of the gospel (vs.14).

His resurrection is connected to our sins (vs 17).

His resurrection is connected to our hope (vs.19).

His resurrection is connected to kingdom or church (vs 24).

His resurrection connected to our victory (vs 57).

His resurrection connected to our work in the Lord (vs 58).

Resurrection - to live for Christ

Raised "with" Christ • (Col. 3:1) to "put" on Christ • (Gal. 3:27) to "walk a new life" • (Rom. 6:4) which is a "life" for Christ • (Phil. 1:21)

Romans 6

The resurrection of the sinner is connected to his freedom. Freedom from sin (vss. 7,18,22), but not freedom to sin (vss.1-3).

The resurrection of the sinner is connected to his righteousness. The raised sinner is now an instrument (vs 13) and servant (vs 18) of righteousness.

Resurrection - to live with Christ

(I Thessalonians 4:16,18)

■ 1 Thess. 4:16-18

The resurrection of the saved is connected to our eternal fellowship, family and future (vs 17).

One must die saved (Rev.14:13) and be raised saved (I Thess. 4:16) to be eternally saved (IThess. 4:17; Romans 6:23).

But now Christ is risen from the dead, and has become the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep. 21 For since by man came death, by Man also came the resurrection of the dead. 22 For as in Adam all die, even so in Christ all shall be made alive.
